Enlisted in Grantham and was killed in action 13 Oct 1915 aged 19 and commemorated on the Loos Memorial panel 31-34.

Enlisted Newark Nottinghamshire and died of wounds 27 October 1915 aged 17 and buried at Abbeville Communal Cemetery, grave reference III C 15
Tpr	Ogden	C	1 <sup>st</sup> Lincolnshire Yeomanry	<b>Private 1829 Charles Ogden</b> enlisted in Lincoln killed in action at sea 3 Nov 1915
L Cpl	Coy	A	8 <sup>th</sup> Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment	<b>Lance/Corporal 111858 Arthur Coy</b> , son of Thomas and Alice Ann Coy of Barowby. Enlisted in Grantham and killed in action 21 Jan 1916 aged 25 and buried in Citie Bonjean Cemetery Armentieres, grave reference IX E 86
Driver	Bates	JW	"B Battery" 152 <sup>nd</sup> Brigade Royal Field Artillery	<b>Driver 23350 John William Bates</b> son of Annie Bates, of Billingborough, Lincs, and the late Thomas Hague Bates; husband of Fanny Bates, of High Rd., Barrowby, Grantham, Lincs. Died 27 March 1916 aged 38 and buried at Ste Marie Cemetery Le Havre grave reference Div 19 V 2

<b>1<sup>st</sup> Cl Sto</b>	<b>Gascoigne</b>	<b>F</b>	HMS Queen Mary	<b>1<sup>st</sup> Class Stoker Frederick Gascoigne</b> born 14 June 1895, son of Fanny Gascoigne address given as Nr White Swan High Road Barrowby, killed or died as a direct result of enemy action, 31 May 1916 but his body was not recovered for burial	
<b>Trpr</b>	<b>Darby</b>	<b>GE</b>	South Nottinghamshire Hussars	<b>Private 1974 George Edward Darby</b> son of Edward and Hannah Darby of Barrowby died 6 July 1916 and buried at Salonika (Lembet Road) Military Cemetery grave reference 200	
<b>Pte</b>	<b>Gascoigne</b>	<b>A</b>	1 <sup>st</sup> Battalion Grenadier Guards	<b>Private 22487 Albert Gascoigne</b> , son of James and Frances Ellen Gascoigne, of High Rd., Barrowby, Grantham. Died of wounds 22 Oct 1916 aged 23 and buried in All Saints Churchyard	
<b>Pte</b>	<b>Bryan</b>	<b>TE</b>	5 <sup>th</sup> Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment	<b>Private 241918 Thomas Edward Bryan</b> born Gonerby and living in Barrowby, enlisted in Grantham and killed in action 11 April 1917 and buried at St Emilie Valley Cemetery Villers Faucon grave reference IV F 15	
<b>Pte</b>	<b>Bointon</b>	<b>N</b>	2 <sup>nd</sup> Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment	<b>Private 21295 Norman Bointon</b> born and enlisted in Grantham killed in action 28 April 1917 and buried at Roeux British Cemetery grave reference B24. The Commonwealth War Graves Commission website gives his regiment as 10 <sup>th</sup> Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment	
<b>Cpl</b>	<b>Smith</b>	<b>W</b>	7 <sup>th</sup> Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment	<b>Corporal 11649 Walter Smith</b> born in Denton and living in Barrowby and Enlisted in Grantham., husband of Lily M Smith was killed in action aged 24 on 12 Oct 1917 and is commemorated on the Tyne Cot memorial addenda panel	
<b>Sgt</b>	<b>Musson</b>	<b>J F</b>	3 <sup>rd</sup> Battalion Coldstream Guards	<b>Sergeant 5968 John Francis Musson MM</b> son of John Francis and Alice Musson of Mill Rd (sp) Row? husband of Mrs. S. M. Musson subsequently Freeston, of 5, Rutland St., Grantham. Born in Barrowby and enlisted in Grantham. Killed in action aged 30 on 24 Nov 1917 and is commemorated on the Cambrai Memorial, Louveral Panel 2	
<b>Pte</b>	<b>Musson</b>	<b>T F</b>	1 <sup>st</sup> Battalion Scots Guards	<b>Private (Guardsmen) 16648 Thomas Francis Musson</b> son of Walter and Charlotte A Musson of 13 Water Lane Halifax. Born in Barrowby and enlisted in Halifax and was killed in action on 27 November 1917 and is commemorated on the Cambrai Memorial, Louveral Panel 2	Walter and Charlotte Musson had been the licensees of the White Swan and I think that John Thomas Musson the baker and Walter (Thomas' father) were brothers.

Died of wounds aged 36 on 8 March 1918 and is buried at Lapugnoy Military Cemetery Grave reference VII B 10	“Soldiers Died” gives place of birth as Bottesford and residence as Sedgebrook
<b>CSM</b>	<b>Swallow</b>	<b>A B</b>	470 <sup>th</sup> Field Company Royal Engineers	<b>Acting Company Sergeant Major 2763 Alfred Bailey Swallow Long Service and Good Conduct Medal; King George's Delhi Durbar Medal.</b> Son of the late Frederick William and Annie Swallow, of Barrowby Mill, Grantham; husband of Ethel Martha Swallow, of 46, Houghton Rd., Grantham. Born [in Barrowby] and enlisted in Grantham was killed in action on 21 Mar 1918 aged 37 and is commemorated on the Arras Memorial bay 1	
<b>Cpl</b>	<b>Skipworth</b>	<b>J P</b>	255 <sup>th</sup> Brigade Royal Field Artillery	<b>Gunner 191626 John Patrick Skipworth</b> D Battery 255 <sup>th</sup> Bgde lived and enlisted in Grantham and was killed in action on 21 Mar 1918 and is commemorated on the Arras Memorial Bay 1	
<b>Pte</b>	<b>Peatman</b>	<b>A</b>	4 <sup>th</sup> Brigade Nottinghamshire and Derby Regiment (The Sherwood Foresters) / 167 <sup>th</sup> Company Machine Gun Corps	<b>Private 124994 Arthur Peatman</b> born in Barrowby and enlisted in Mansfield initially in the 4th Notts and Derby regiment – service number 92859. He was killed in action on 28 March 1918 and is commemorated on the Arras Memorial Bay 10	
<b>Pte</b>	<b>Battersby</b>	<b>G</b>	193 <sup>rd</sup> Company Machine Gun Corps	<b>Private 54990 George Battersby</b> , born and enlisted in Grantham initially in the London regiment - service number 6262. He was the son of the late George and Mary Battersby, of Grantham; husband of Kate A. Battersby (subsequently Kenny), of 2 High Rd., Barrowby, Grantham, Lincs. Was killed aged 33 on 30 Mar 1918 and is buried at Anzin - St Aubin British Cemetery grave reference III B 23	
<b>Pte</b>	<b>Holmes</b>	<b>A</b>	2/4 <sup>th</sup> Kings Own Yorkshire Light Infantry	<b>Private 44610 Alfred Basil Holmes</b> son of Joseph and Jane Holmes, of Sproxton Mill, Melton Mowbray, Leicestershire enlisted in Melton Mowbray and was killed in action aged 20 on 20 Jul 1918 and is commemorated on the Soissons Memorial	
<b>Pte</b>	<b>Garratt</b>	<b>J</b>	1 <sup>st</sup> Battalion City of London Regiment / Royal Army Medical Corps	<b>Private 508147 J R Garratt</b> RAMC 29 <sup>th</sup> Gen Hosp, son of Richard Garratt of Barrowby. Born in Alford and enlisted in Chelsea died aged 26 on 4 Oct 1918 and is buried in Mikra British Cemetery Kalamaria

<b>Pte</b>	<b>Green</b>	<b>T</b>	20 <sup>th</sup> Battalion Manchester Regiment	<b>Private 40051 Tom Green</b> born in Bassingthorpe and enlisted in Lincoln initially in the Lincolnshire regiment – service number 23215. Son of the late George and Mary Green, of Barrowby died of wounds aged 38 on 26 Oct 1918 and is buried in Premont British Cemetery grave reference II B 3
<b>Pte</b>	<b>Southern</b>	<b>T</b>	15 <sup>th</sup> Battalion Lancashire Fusiliers	<b>Private 55058 Thomas Southern</b> son of John and Martha Southern, of Barrowby; husband of Mrs. A. Southern (subsequently Summerfield), of Maltings Yard, Barrowby, Grantham. Born and living in Barrowby and enlisted in Grantham. Died of wounds aged 24 on 6 Nov 1918 and is buried in Premont British Cemetery grave reference III A 6
<b>Pte</b>	<b>Southern</b>	<b>J</b>	Royal Welsh Fusiliers / 6 <sup>th</sup> Battalion Kings Shropshire Light Infantry / Machine Gun Corps	<b>Private 83284 Joseph Southern</b> son of William Southern; husband of D. M. Southern (subsequently Durrands), of 1, Manner St., Grantham. Born at Oswestry, Salop. In 1911 he enlisted initially as a reservist with the Royal Welsh Fusiliers – service number 4257 then transferred to the regular army into the 6th King's Shropshire LI - service number 9924 and was subsequently transferred to MGC. He died of pneumonia at Belton Military Hospital aged 27 on 19 November 1918 and is buried in All Saints churchyard
<b>L Cpl</b>	<b>Blackbourne</b>	<b>J W</b>	10 <sup>th</sup> Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment / Essex Regiment	<b>Lance Corporal 49763 James Blackbourne MM</b> Son of George Henry and Mary Blackbourne, of Denton. Enlisted initially in the 10 <sup>th</sup> Bn Lincolnshire Regiment – service number 4901 and was subsequently transferred to the Essex Regiment . He died aged 29 on 28 Dec 1918 and is buried in St Nicholas Churchyard, Barkston
